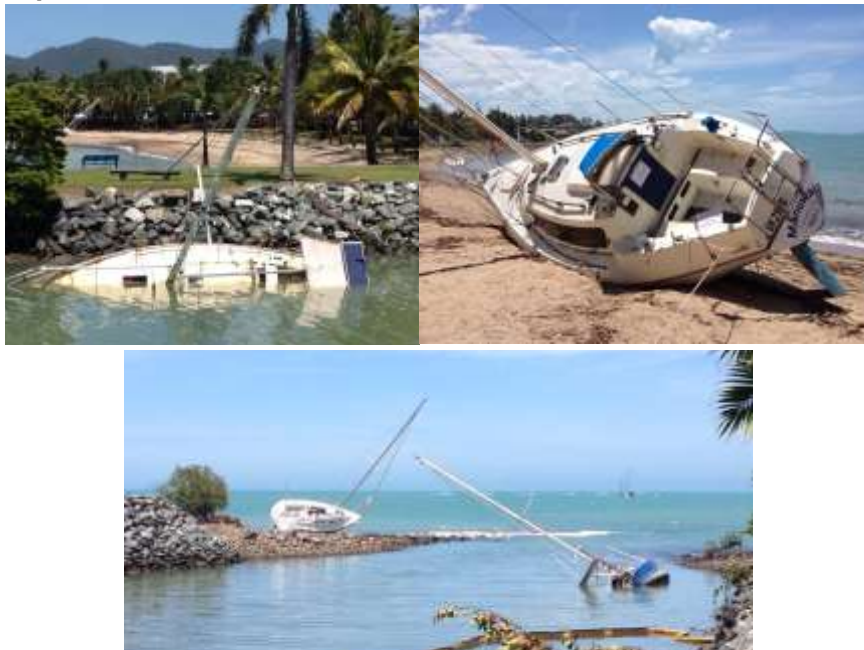

Spend the rest of your day at leisure on the island of Langkawi. Enjoy breathtaking views of the islands, rural lowlands and the seas as far as Thailand on the famous Cable Car, only 5km from the hotel. Or, if you’re looking for some retail therapy head to Kuah -once a rustic town, now a thriving duty free shopping haven. Alternatively join us by the pool at the Sheraton and enjoy a treatment at the Spa.

Monday February 11 Hotel Check out and Yacht Embarkation

On-board and spend the evening at own leisure. Possibly SUNDOWNERS at the Royal Langkawi Yacht Club Bar???

Tuesday February 12 Langkawi to Koh Lipe – 35NM

Depart early morning for Koh Lipe. This island is part of the Butang group, granite

A café in Walking Street makes and sells the best pastries you will eat in Thailand.

Koh Lipe has three main beaches: Pattaya, Sunset and Sunrise. Pattaya Beach, in Koh Lipe south, is the most popular and has a wide variety of restaurants and bars.

Wednesday February 13 Butang Island Group

Enjoy the clearest waters and most beautiful coral gardens in the Andaman Sea. Spend another day in Koh Lipe or venture off into the Butang Group and anchor at the beautiful Koh Adang or Koh Rawi.

Thursday February 14 Koh Lipe to Tarutao – 25NM

Taruato itself is a national park and off the beach at Ao Pante there are several mooring buoys to tie up to for the night. Ao Pante is home to the 'Crocodile Cave', a stunning limestone cave found several kilometres along the mangrove creek by dingy.

There are more great anchorages to be discovered on Taruato including Ao Talo Udang. Once ashore look for a lonely historic outpost which was originally a site of a penal colony for male and female political prisoners, a salt factory and later a busy village..

Friday February 15 Tarutao to Koh Bulon - 10NM

Anchor just off the beach and dinghy ashore. This very remote and unspoilt little place has been discovered by some of the northern Europeans looking for relief from their winter. It is simple and quiet - a little piece of heaven almost extinct in our busy tourist world. Enjoy lunch ashore at the simple beach restaurant which has great food.

Saturday February 16 Koh Bulon to Koh Muk – 35NM

If you arrive early enough and the tides are right visit the Emerald Cave. Swim through the entrance with a water-proof torch to guide you into the open air Hong (room), or follow one of the locals in. Please refer to tide charts before entering. Enjoy dinner in one of the restaurants on the beach or eat on board.

Sunday February 17 Koh Muk to Koh Lanta – 15NM

Anchor in Kantiang Bay on the South Western side of Koh Lanta. From here you can arrange a tour to Old Lanta Town (highly recommended), organise an elephant trek or even scuba diving. Alternatively, make a reservation for a lunch or pampering at the Pimalai Resort and Spa.

- **Dinner has been arranged and pre-paid at Baan Lanta Restaurant for 7:30PM**

Monday February 18 Koh Lanta to Phi Phi Don – 25NM

When approached by yachts the Phi Phi islands rise up from the sea like a fortress, sheer cliffs tower overhead then give way to a beachfront jungle. It's love at first sight. Add the laid back lifestyle and you will understand why Phi Phi Don is now world famous. **Dinner has be arranged and pre-paid at the Phi Phi Island Cabana Hotel for 7:30P. Wi Fi Available...for a small fee.**

Tuesday February 19 Phi Phi Don or Phi Phi Lei

Phi Phi Don is the larger of the two islands and has a built up infrastructure including resorts, restaurants, bars, dive schools, fishing and tour operators, masseurs, internet cafes, and souvenir shops.

Wednesday February 20 Phi Phi Don to Railay – 20NM

Located in the clear southern waters of Phang Na Bay is Krabi. The nearby islands offer terrific snorkelling, but onshore is where the action is - Railay is world famous for its beach bar culture..

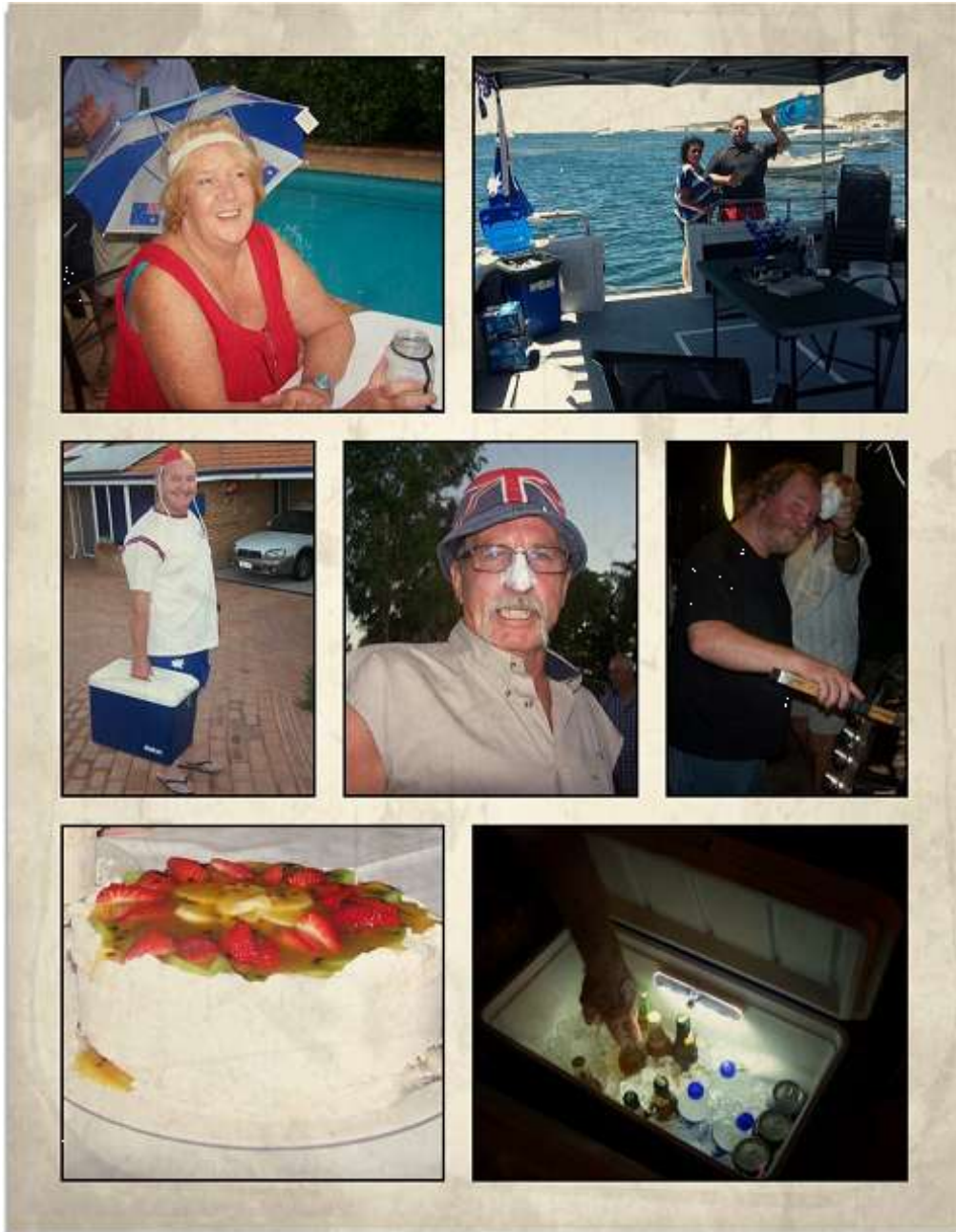

“VICE COMMODORES” CAERNARFON NORTH WALES AND
PORTRHDAFARCH ANGLESEY



Our yacht, Cinnabar of Solent, is currently in Ionian Greece, wintering in Messalonghi, the sacred city of Greece. We left Caernarfon, North Wales when we retired in 2005. Our journey since then has taken us to Western France, Northern Spain, Portugal, South West Spain then through the Straits of Gibraltar to the Mediterranean. We explored the Costas Del Sol and Blanca before sailing to the beautiful Balearic Islands, Sardinia, Sicily and through the straits of Messina to Italy. The last Italian port of call was Santa Maria di Leuca which was our departing point for Corfu and Ionian Greece. For the past two seasons we have sailed in the Ionian exploring the Islands where a safe anchorage can always be found, occasionally hiring a motor bike to explore the interior of the islands. Anchorages are always free and town Quays are reasonably priced or free, a great contrast to Spain and Italy where you could pay as much as 200euro a night for a 36ft yacht in some marinas and 70euro to anchor in the high season. We expect to explore other Greek waters this summer, probably the Sporades, Dodecanese, and Peloponnese.

We are also members of the Royal Welsh Yacht Club in Carnarfon.

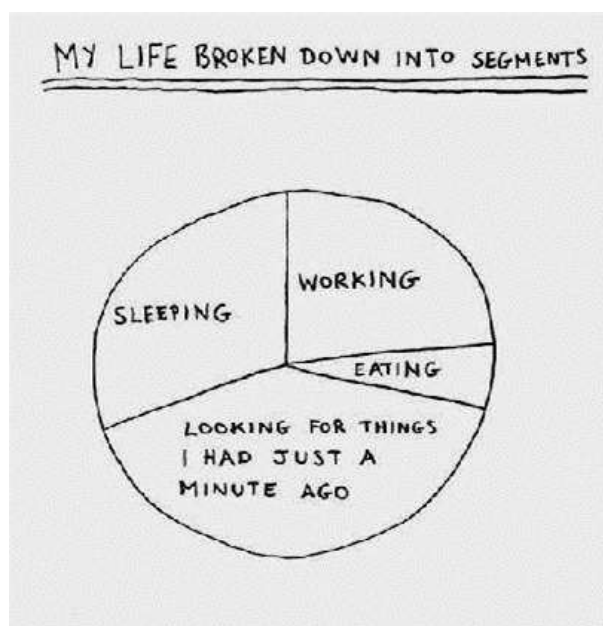

They live on their PDQ 36 sailing catamaran at the Naval Air Station Boca Chica.

Dennis is a US Coast Guard licensed master for vessels up to 100 gross tons and has a sail and tow endorsement. They run a sailboat and powerboat delivery service worldwide, a sailing school in Fort Lauderdale and Dennis is currently upgrading his license to 500 gross tons. They live in Key West which is home to many festivals.

Race Week occurs the third week in January annually and generally includes 4 or 5 divisions off the top notch sailors in North America.

The Conch Republic Festival, which lasts 8 days in April, re-enacts when Key West as the Conch Republic seceded from the United States, tongue in cheek . The festival includes cannons firing from shore and from boats, biplanes and helicopters which throw Cuban bread and toilet paper at the US Coast Guard vessels, the four schooners, home to Key West, have water fights with all the rest of the local boats, A minimalist boat regatta where the boats can only be made of 1 plywood sheet and 2 rolls of duct tape, and a 15 mile wreckers race with hundreds of sailboats competing.

The next big festival is Hemingway Fest the third week in July each year when they have five Big events: the Running of the Bulls (which is people who dress up their bicycles to look like bulls and Hemingway look alikes who run through the streets in advance), the bed races (where a team of 5 run a course with one in the bed), the drag races which involve drag queens sprinting in high heels around an obstacle course (with a special handicap depending on the height of their heel), a Hemingway Look Alike Contest that lasts 3 days, and a fun run for charity.

Key West has made Halloween into a 10 day festival called Fantasy Fest. It starts with a 2 day Bahama Goombay festival that includes thousands of zombies on bicycles , and grand prizes totaling over 140,000 dollars during the week for the different costume themed events and parties.

The party's themes are wild, like leather and lace party, pretenders in paradise where everyone dresses up as a famous person , Hawaiian luau party, toga party, Tutu Tuesday, The Pirate ball, all of which the main theme is minimal clothing to the point where many wear only paint. On the second to last day, that is Saturday, there is a large parade similar to Mardi Gras where nudity and merriment is the norm.

The first week in November is home to the annual Parrotheads convention named meeting of the minds. These followers of Jimmy Buffett lifestyle of Beaches, bars, boats, and booze have major parties all over the islands with top notch tropical Rock Entertainment which culminate with the entire street shutting down and a 6 hour street party concert, which 2 years ago had a surprise visit by Jimmy Buffett and the Coral Reefer Band who played 3 sets.

The permanent full time population of Key West is approximately 20,000 but that normally swells to 60,000 where every single bed in every single Hotel, Motel, and bed and breakfast are filled for each of these events including Christmas and New Years , where the annual ringing in of the new year has a drag queen lowered in a giant slipper on Duval Street and a pirate wench dropped from the top halyard of 1 of the schooners to the deck. You couple this with artists of all mediums, great fishing, scuba diving and sailing year round in this tropical paradise , and you have a wonderful place to live. Yes, Dennis and Lori deliver yachts worldwide, but they try to be in Key West for each of the festivals because they are so much fun.
