

If you are from Ports South - HOBART, MELBOURNE, ADELAIDE, SYDNEY, Or INTERNATIONAL CRUISERS

By assembling at Lake Macquarie and progress north in company being welcomed by local groups of "vice Commodores" and Sponsors and picking up fellow cruisers on the way.

Lake Macquarie (assembly destination 2018)

The First Year of the SICYC " SEASON OF SAIL" Will commence with the Sail and Drive Beautiful Lake Macquarie.

15 to 18 April 2018.

the concept is to provide a Sail in company for SICYC cruisers on their way north for the cruising season.

SICYC "Vice Commodores" from ports South are invited to converge on Lake Macquarie on or before the 14th of April.

Our hosts Geoff and Ellen King in cooperation with the Local Vice Commodores have created a programme of activities to introduce the group to the Beautiful Lake Macquarie.

If you are not planning to sail north, you are invited to attend by car and or caravan.

The programme

Sunday 15th April 2018 - Welcome lunch at Club Catalina commencing at 1200 hrs. (PAYG). Participating yachts to be anchored either side of Styles Point.

Monday 16th - 0900 SKED on VHF72 followed by a lake sail to a lakeside park, (hopefully south), for a picnic/BBQ lunch. 'Land lubbers' to be hosted on local sail boats. Fleet to then anchor either side of Wangi Wangi depending on wind. Caravans to Wangi Wangi Caravan Park but note there has been a request to Council from Rathmines locals to reopen the old RAAF base carparks to casual caravan parking. This may be resolved by April.

Tuesday 17th - 0900 SKED on VHF72 followed by a sail, to a lakeside park for a picnic/BBQ lunch. Then sail to an anchorage adjacent to a lakeside restaurant or bistro for a closing dinner. (Lubbers may have to follow the fleet by car on this day. Yet to be determined).

Wednesday 18th - provisioning for vessels travelling north. Local VCs will assist with ground transport to supermarkets as required. Water is readily available. Fuel is available from two marinas but deep keeled boats are limited to Marmong Point.

This will be followed by a fully hosted tour of the Clarence River ...

The fleet participating in the SICYC Season of Sail will be welcomed to the Gold Coast by the local "Vice Commodores" at an "ANCHOR UP AND PARTY" celebrating SICYC's 9th birthday on 12 May 2018. The Fleet will be joined by the local "Vice Commodore Fleet" and those who may be joining the Season of Sail at this point.

The ideal anchorage having entered the Southport Bar is in Bums Bay, if not there is adequate anchorage space in front of the Southport VMR and Sea World.

The "ANCHOR UP AND PARTY" will be held at the VMR facility, a short dinghy Pay as you Go for a spit roast meal The VMR is a Licenced Premises. Be formally welcomed by the local Shaggers and dance the night away. Wear your SICYC Polos.

Your Dinghy can be secured a short walk from the Southport VMR facility.

Participants in the season of sail will be presented with information on local attractions, transport, and shopping options while in the area

The days following the ANCHOR UP AND PARTY the fleet will be at leisure to take in the local attractions. Sea World is a short walk from the anchorage.


